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The View from Dacia Boulevard, Director's notes



I am not quite sure of the protocol for how long it can be in January before it is bad form to say "Happy New Year" but I am going to do it anywhere as we start 2024 and a new semester 2 at Heritage. So I wish all our Heritage community a wonderful new year ahead and let us hope this one is prosperous, full of opportunity and success but above all peaceful. I started the new semester back in the UK as I had the privilege of visiting schools in the historic city of Liverpool with our partners, the Global School Alliance, and our COBIS sister school in Kyiv, the British International School of Ukraine. We discussed the projects we will work on in the new year and how despite two years of an awful and senseless war on the people of Ukraine this February, we will continue to support the inspirational work of keeping education and learning continuing in Ukraine as the ultimate symbol of hope and the future.

Tatiana enjoys using social media within and outside of her professional career: *“social media is a wonderful tool to get connected to other like-minded people... 




