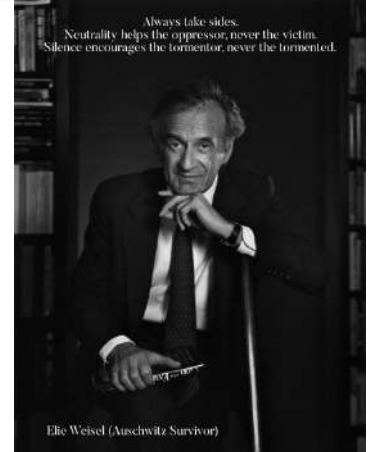

During the EU Code Week students from 6E learned how to express their creativity with code. They used Python Turtle library and wrote sets of instructions to draw shapes, lines and pictures.

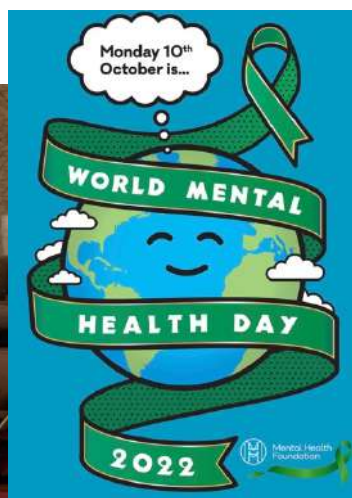
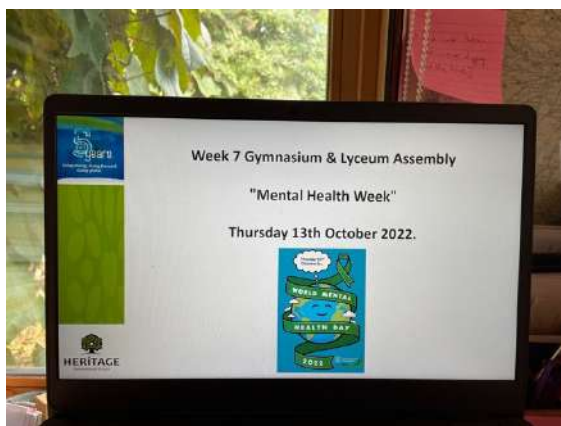

Meet and Code 2022

Heritage students participated on the 11th and the 13th of October in the events "Let's explore the world with Arduino!" <https://meet-and-code.org/ro/ro/event-show/9434> and "Robots can help!" <https://meet-and-code.org/ro/ro/event-show/9443>, programming and technology events within the Europe Code Week 2022 initiative, supported by the European Commission. Students learned about Arduino, an open- source that produces both microcontroller-based development boards and the software part intended for their operation and programming.

Then according to the required steps, the students assembled the products using Arduino kits. The first product was the creation of a lamp lighting system activated by clapping hands. Meet and Code for our school means new steps towards digital development and towards the European community. We confidently applied to participate and be with the schools in the European countries, to complete the tool fund with new kits, being available for all students of the school during the Technology lessons and clubs. Another goal was making learning programming fun and accessible for both boys and girls.



IGCSE 2 students Bogdana Bujag, Cristina Meleca and Sabina Țurcan participated in the intercultural exchange program in the children's village in Trogen, Switzerland, in August, 2022. They were involved in non-formal educational activities together with other young people from countries where the project was also implemented with the support of the Pestalozzi Children's

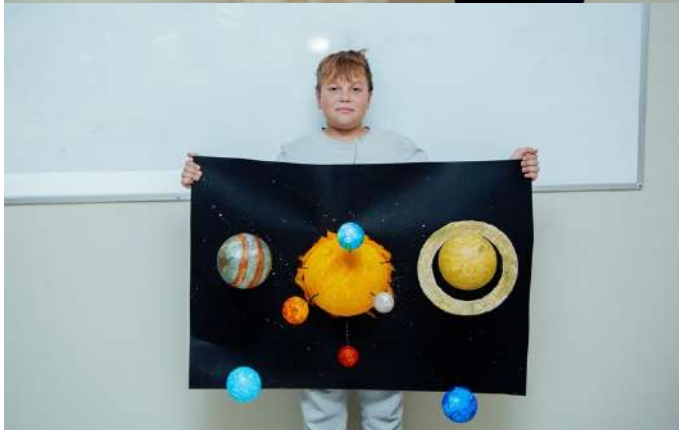

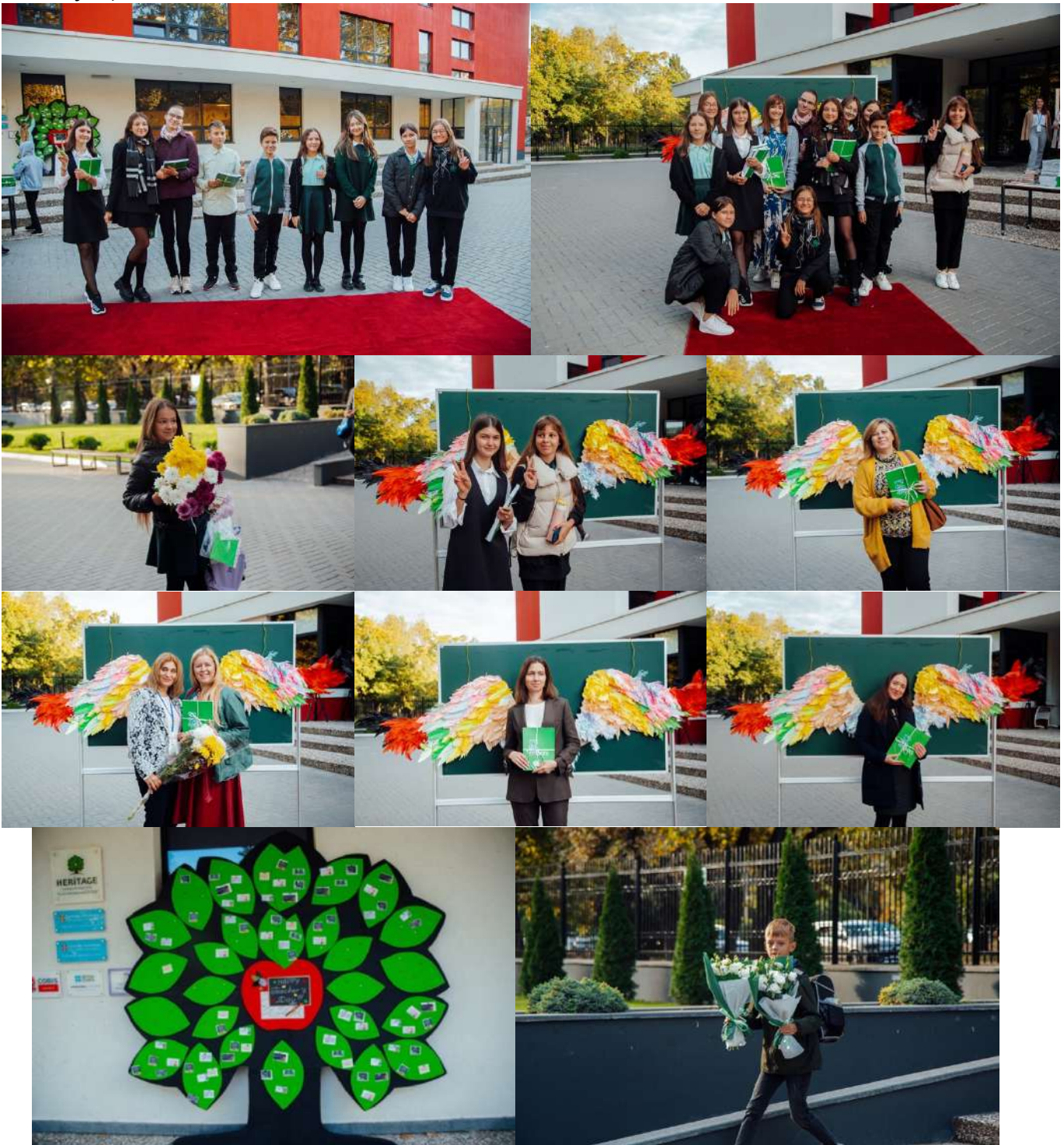


STUDENT LEADERSHIP

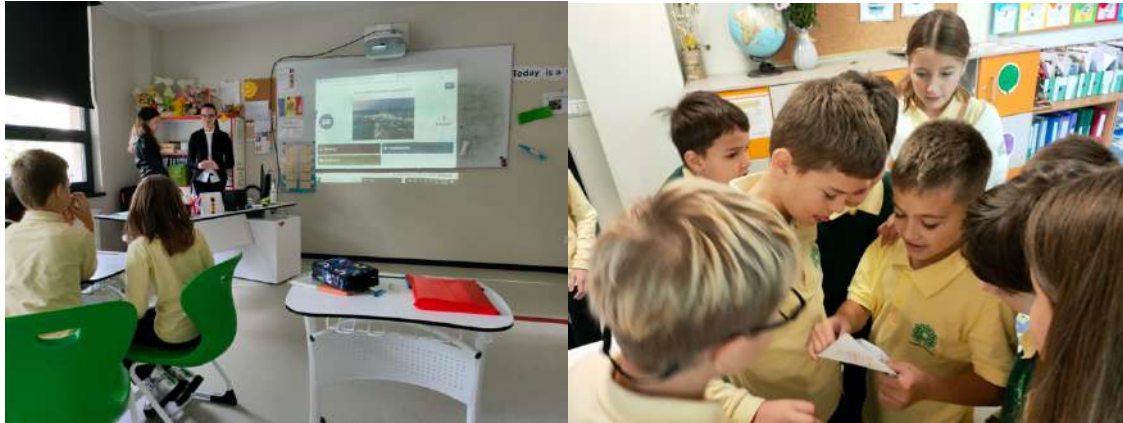








On World Teacher's Day, the 11th grade students held a fabulous lesson with the 4th grade students. Surprises and positive emotions completed this significant day.

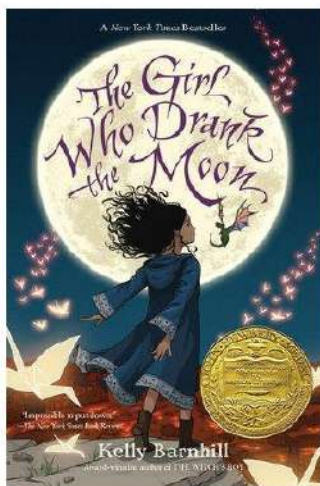

Mrs. Rodica Balan, Heritage librarian has some book recommendations for our students (Ages 8-14).

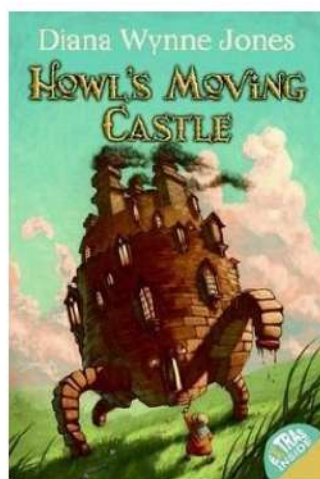


The Girl Who Drank the Moon by Kelly Barnhill is an expertly crafted fantasy with spiritual undertones, and it won the 2017 Newbery Medal. It has a strong female protagonist, Luna, described as having curly black hair and amber skin. Luna's taken from her family and saved by a kindhearted witch who lovingly raises her but accidentally imbues her with magical powers. Other members of Luna's adopted family are a frisky young dragon and a wise, poetry-loving bog monster. Multiple storylines come together in a dramatic climax espousing the power of love and nonviolence.

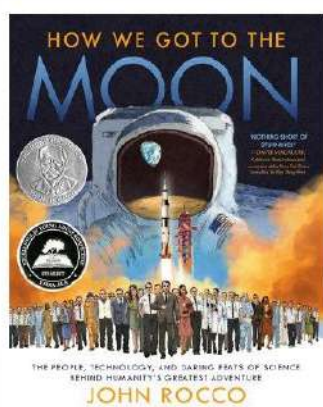
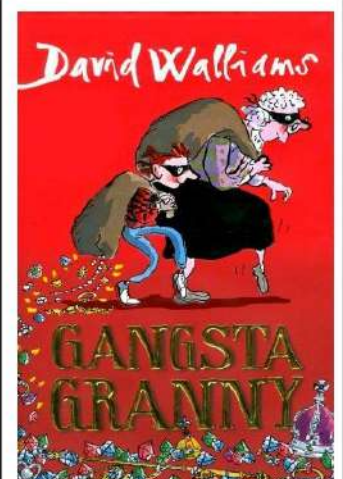


Matilda was one of Roald Dahl's last ever novels and also one of his greatest. First published in 1988, it has been adapted into multiple plays and movies since all of which have received success. It's a story of a little girl with magical powers and a love for knowledge. She's independent and intelligent and an incredible role model for kids everywhere. The novel has entertaining scenes and memorable characters that have stayed with children for generations.

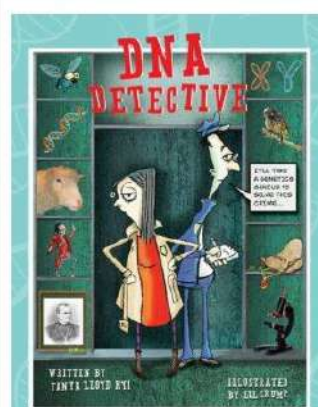
Howl's Moving Castle by Diana Wynne Jones is a fantasy story that deals with issues of identity and fate. It is a wonderful story about the ways that outward appearances can be deceiving, how we can overcome our own perceptions of what we can do—even an ordinary person can save a powerful wizard if she is in love. Miyazaki's movie is based on this book.



A story of prejudice and acceptance, funny lists and silly words. Our hero Ben is bored beyond belief after he is made to stay at his grandma's house.
